Introduction

Score reports provide current score information for each student who completed the PSATTM 8/9 test administration at your school.

New Developments

The overall structure of the data file layout for 2025-26 is NOT changing—the file remains the same size, and fields previously reported remain in the same position when compared to the 2024-25 data layouts.

Score Report Delivery and Data Access

Electronic score reports are accessed via the SAT® Suite of Assessments online K–12 score reporting portal at **k12reports.collegeboard.org**. For more information on the K–12 score reporting portal, see **satsuite.collegeboard.org/help-center/k12-reporting-portal**.

Electronic score reports are delivered in 2 formats: comma-delimited (CSV) and fixed-width (.txt). This document outlines the specifications for the fixed-width data layout. (positions 1–6)

Guidance Purposes Only Indicator (position 539)

This field indicates whether or not the reported scores can be used for guidance purposes only. If "Y" is reported, these scores can only be used by states, districts, and schools for educational guidance purposes and shall not be reported to any other organizations.



Test Scores

(positions 567–576)

The PSAT 8/9 contains 3 scores, including a total score, a Reading and Writing section score, and a Math section score. The total score is on a scale of 240-1440; Reading and Writing, and Math section scores are on a scale of 120–720.

Knowledge and Skills

(positions 597–666)

These fields report a student's knowledge and skills performance in the Reading and Writing and Math sections, including performance in 4 content domains in Reading and Writing and 4 content domains in Math. One of 7 performance score bands are reported. Performance score bands divide the Reading and Writing and Math sections' score scales into ranges of score points broad enough to allow for meaningful generalizations to be drawn about successively higher levels of student performance demonstrated on the digital SAT Suite tests.

Percentiles

(positions 687–710)

The PSAT 8/9 uses 4 percentile ranks. Nationally representative percentiles are derived via a research study sample of U.S. students in the student's grade (8th or 9th), weighted to represent all U.S. students in that grade, regardless of whether they typically take the PSAT 8/9. User group percentiles are based on the actual performance of test takers on the PSAT 8/9. We additionally report state percentiles (for U.S.-based testers) and country percentiles that are based on actual performance of test takers on the PSAT 8/9 in a student's state and/or country.

College and Career Readiness Benchmarks

(positions 731–732)

For the PSAT 8/9, college and career readiness benchmark indicators are included at the section-level scores. As shown in our research, benchmark attainment is related to many positive college outcomes and can be a useful tool in measuring the college readiness of high school students.

(positions 753–758)

AP Potential AP Potential[™] fields will be populated based on the student's performance on the PSAT 8/9 assessment. AP Potential is calculated as follows:

> For 9th graders, AP Potential is calculated for European History, World History, Art History, Human Geography, Computer Science Principles, and Seminar only.

For 8th graders, AP Potential is not calculated for any courses.

For those courses where AP Potential is not calculated, the field will be blank.

Note: The AP Potential reported in the K-12 score reporting portal is the same information provided to the student. Additional information on AP Potential can be found in the AP Potential Tool at appotential.collegeboard.org/app/ welcome.do.

Date of Report

(positions 779–788)

This field indicates the date a student's score record was generated into the file. The date of report, like all other date fields, is in the YYYY-MM-DD format. It can be used to determine the most recent information when multiple records are created for the same student.
