Practicing for the digital SAT® isn't too different from practicing for the paper and pencil SAT; in fact, it's just as easy! With the addition of new digital practice options, along with some familiar resources, we've made test preparation easily accessible for you.

BLUEBOOK TEST PREVIEW

Our digital testing application, Bluebook™, comes with a test preview. This tool will help you familiarize yourself with functions in the app, see the structure of the test, try sample Reading and Writing and Math test questions, and try all testing tools you're approved to use, including assistive technology.

TAKE A DIGITAL SAT PRACTICE TEST

Make a trial run of test day by taking a full-length adaptive practice test in Bluebook. You'll need a pen or pencil and an acceptable calculator, and a clock (if you prefer it to the app's built-in calculator. You could also have a clock handy for timing your break.) Find everything you need to know about practicing for the digital SAT.

Getting and Sending Scores

What You Need to Know

WHEN WILL I GET MY SCORES?

Your SAT scores will be available to you online about 2–3 weeks after test day. Go to satsuite.collegeboard.org/sat/scores/sat-score-release-dates to see updated SAT score release dates.

HOW DO I GET MY SCORES?

Online: All students will get their scores online at studentscores.collegeboard.org through their College Board account. You'll get an email telling you how to sign in to your online score report when scores are ready.

Phone: You can get SAT scores by phone starting on the day they're released online, but there's an extra fee.

WHAT DO MY SCORES MEAN?

Your online scores come with additional insights into your strengths and areas for improvement. Some quick facts:

- Your total score on the SAT is the sum of your scores for the Reading and Writing section and the Math section. The total score is reported on a 400–1600 point scale.
- You'll also see other scores and color-coded graphics to help you better understand your performance across the sections of the test.

HOW DO I SEND MY SCORES TO UNIVERSITIES?

You decide which colleges, universities, or scholarship programs College Board should send your scores to.

You can:

- Send scores with your registration. Your test registration fee covers 4 score reports. We'll send just the scores from the registered test date (or you can change this default online).
- If you want to change where your scores are sent, you have until 9 days after the test date to alter your 4 free score reports at no charge. After that, you'll be charged the additional score report request fee for any added or changed report requests.
- Send score reports at any time. There's a fee for sending additional score reports. Send scores by using your online account.

WHEN WILL COLLEGES GET MY SCORES?

Score recipients listed on your registration receive your scores online within 10 days after you receive your scores. Additional reports take 1–3 weeks to process after we receive the request. Rush reporting is available for an extra fee. Keep in mind that institutions vary in terms of how and when they receive scores and how long they take to process them.

If you've tested more than 1 time, you can also consider Score Choice™. Score Choice is a score reporting feature that lets you choose which scores—by test date—you send to colleges, in accordance with an institution's stated score-use practice. It's optional—if you decide not to use Score Choice, your 6 most recent SAT scores will be sent to your recipients. You should feel comfortable sending all your scores, because most colleges consider a student's best score. Although College Board no longer administers the SAT Subject Tests™, scores that you earned in up to 6 past SAT Subject Test administrations will be included in additional score reports.
