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4 Technical Readiness Reminders

The Technology Coordinator works with the Test Coordinator and SSD Coordinator to meet student needs for test day.

The Technology Coordinator:

- Ensures devices used for testing meet technical specifications.
- Install Bluebook on student devices for testing.
- Test network configuration and check internet connectivity in each testing room.

Some things to Consider:

- Depending on how technology is managed, it may be necessary to engage both your district and the school building technology coordinator. (Technology training can be accessed at the above link.)
- Bluebook is compatible with [Chromebooks](#), [Windows](#), [Macs](#), and [iPads](#).
- In instances where testing extends over several days or involves sessions on the same day, the same devices can serve multiple students. However, it is critical that these devices maintain sufficient power throughout each student's testing session.

Your testing schedule also influences network requirements. Increased students testing correlates with higher network loads. Additionally, the technology coordinator needs to ensure that any For detailed information, refer to the [Network Requirements](#) section.

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5 Submitting Paper-Based Accommodations

Most students will take the digital SAT test. However, in rare cases where a student is unable to test using a computer, the SSD coordinator should submit a request for paper testing through SSD Online. It is advisable to make these requests well in advance of any SSD deadlines to ensure timely approval and the delivery of necessary materials.

Please note:

- The paper version of the digital SAT is not adaptive.
- The paper test is a longer testing experience (do not use digital timing guides for a paper test).
- SSD coordinators or other testing staff will be responsible for transcribing the student's paper test responses into Bluebook and subsequently returning the paper test materials to the College Board.

Request paper accommodations through SSD Online. From The accommodations categories screen select **Reading/ Seeing Text**. Select **Other (documentation required)** then select **Other Reading / Seeing Text (Documentation Required)** and request a paper test for the digital assessment and follow all other guidelines for this request.

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6 Review Accommodation Needs

In Ohio, the SSD Coordinator should keep a record of students with approved test day accommodations and track those with pending requests.

- Students cannot test with pending accommodations, as the approval process is necessary before any accommodations can be provided on the test day.
- Review the student list to confirm the validity of accommodations for those previously approved, including students who participated in fall testing, those with recent accommodation changes, and those in need of new accommodation requests.

Certain accommodations may necessitate the use of assistive technology, a resource already familiar to students in their regular classrooms. However, additional support from the technology coordinator may be required.

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7 Preparing Your Students for Test Day

Bluebook practice:

If your school has Bluebook installed on its devices, students can conveniently access Bluebook using their College Board account login. If your district has previously installed Bluebook for fall testing, there is no need to reinstall; regular updates should be performed to ensure the smooth functioning of the test.

Within the Practice and Prepare section on the Bluebook homepage, students will encounter both test previews and full-length practice tests.

- **Test Preview:** The test preview consists of a brief set of questions designed to give students a practical understanding of how testing functions within Bluebook. It's important to note that students won't receive a score or any feedback on their answers.
- **Full-Length Practice:** These tests are scored, providing students with valuable insights into areas that may require focused study. Full-length practice tests mirror the timing constraints of real tests, allowing users the flexibility to pause at any point during the assessment.

Paper practice tests are available for students who will be testing with accommodations that require a paper format, or for students who are just looking for additional sample questions.

As part of the Digital Readiness Check prior to test day, students are provided test tickets that will allow them to access Bluebook as they would on test day and access the test preview and full-length practice either in the classroom or at home.

Students may also download Bluebook to a personal device and access these resources using their College Board account.
