
Student Readiness Check

Taking a full-length practice test in Bluebook™, the digital testing app, lets students get to know its helpful testing tools (bluebook.org/testing-tools), sample the different types of test questions, and try out the built-in Desmos calculator. Students will also confirm that their name, date of birth, and accommodations are correct.

By providing a mobile phone number during exam setup, students can use the free BigFuture® School* mobile app to get their test scores easily and explore customized college and career guidance right on their phones. Select four free score sends (SAT School Day only)

When students take the SAT®, they can choose up to four colleges, universities, or scholarship programs to receive their scores for free. Students should review the codes they'll need to provide ahead of time at bigfuture.collegeboard.org/colleges and bring them on test day.



Enter the National Merit Scholarship Program (PSAT/NMSQT only)

Students who take the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT®) will have the opportunity to enter the National Merit® Scholarship Program by answering a few questions to determine eligibility. The National Merit Scholarship Program is an academic competition for recognition and scholarships administered by National Merit Scholarship Corporation.
